1. Introduction

The European Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to [Regulation \(EU\) 2018/1725](#) of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data in the context of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event** (23–24 November 2021) organised by the European Commission. It explains the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to the processing of personal data linked to the specific event, organised by the services of the European Commission, is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

Purpose of the processing operation: the European Commission collects and further processes your personal data to provide you with information about the specific International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** (before, during and after) and to process your application for participation in the that International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**.

Your personal data will not be used for any automated decision-making including profiling.

Web-streaming and audio-visual recording at the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** of the speakers, organisers and participants, as well as photographs (screenshots) of the speakers and panoramic photographs of participants (group screenshots) and organisers will be taken in the context of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** and might be published on IURC website during or after the event (on www.iurc.eu and potentially on related social media – [Twitter](#), [LinkedIn](#), [YouTube](#) or [Instagram](#)).

Participants that do not wish to be part of the above web-streaming and recording/publishing activities have the possibility to object to processing, by keeping their cameras turned off for the whole duration of the event.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

The processing operations on personal data, linked to the organisation, management, follow-up and promotion of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** (including web-streaming, photos, audio-visual recording) are necessary for the management and functioning of the Commission, as mandated by the Treaties. Those provisions are in particular based on *Art. 1(2)(d) of the Regulation (EU) 234/2014 establishing a Partnership Instrument for cooperation with third countries (“Partnership Instrument Regulation”)* as well as on Article 11 of the Treaty on European Union and Article 15 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union.

Consequently, those processing operations are lawful under Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body).

Your consent is required for the following actions during the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**:

- the sharing of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** attendee list containing your name and affiliation among participants, in order to create working groups or to continue the collaborate work launched during the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**.
- the processing of your personal data for inviting you to future events the data controller may organise;
- processing and publishing (on www.iurc.eu and potentially on related social media – [Twitter](#), [LinkedIn](#), [YouTube](#) or [Instagram](#)) of audio-visual recording of the **IURC Annual Event 2021** which might include the speakers, organisers and participants, as well as photographs (screenshots) of the speakers and panoramic photographs of participants (group screenshots) and organisers.

If you opt-in, you are giving us your explicit consent under Article 5(1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 to process your personal data for those specific purposes. You can give your consent via a clear affirmative act by ticking the box on the online registration form under the mention: “I have read and I agree with the privacy statement”.

Your consent for these services can be withdrawn at any time by sending an email to coordination-unit@iurc.eu.

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

The following personal data may be processed in the context of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**:

- contact details (e-mail address first name, last name, function/title, name of organisation, city);

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing.

For each of the categories of personal data that may be processed, please find below the retention details and the reference to the relevant record of processing:

- Personal data related to the organisation and management of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** (this includes the information given during the registration, before, during or after the International Urban and Regional

Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**) will be kept for **five years** after the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**.

- Recordings from the web-streamed International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** will be kept for **2 years** before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00306 (Web-streaming of Commission events).
- In case of audio-visual recording of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**, the recordings will be kept for **3 months** after the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** before being deleted. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-01937 (Audio-visual recording of meetings).
- Personal data shared with the controller for future mailing purposes (e.g., for receiving newsletters or invitations to similar events) are processed in line with the Record of Processing DPR-EC-03928 (Management of subscriptions to receive information) and the specific privacy statement prepared by the organising Commission service.
- Selected service providers for organisational purposes (such as caterers, travel agents or event management organisations) are contractually bound to process personal data on behalf of and in line with the instructions of the data controller, keep confidential any data they process and protect it from unauthorised access, use and retention.

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. The following contractor is used to assist the controller in the implementation of the the processing operation ‘International Urban and Regional Cooperation – IURC Annual Event – 23-24 November 2021’ in the context of the EU funded project PI/2020/420-012 Central Services to the International Urban and Regional Cooperation (IURC): Sustainable and innovative cities and regions: INGENIERIA ESPECIALIZADA OBRA CIVIL E INDUSTRIAL SA - ACCIONA Ingeniería.. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to [Commission Decision \(EU, Euratom\) 2017/46](#) of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

The Commission’s processors (contractors) are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your personal data on behalf of the Commission and by the confidentiality obligations deriving from the General Data Protection Regulation (‘GDPR’ - [Regulation \(EU\) 2016/679](#)). The processors have to put in place appropriate technical and organisational measures to ensure the level of security, required by the Commission.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the “need to know” principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with the following service providers for the purposes of organising the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021**: *INGENIERIA ESPECIALIZADA OBRA CIVIL E INDUSTRIAL SA - ACCIONA Ingeniería*.

Cookies

Cookies are short text files stored on a user’s device (such as a computer, tablet or phone) by a website. Cookies are used for the technical functioning of a website (functional cookies) or for gathering statistics (analytical cookies).

If registration for the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** takes place via a Commission website, the cookies employed by the Commission on the registrant’s device for that purpose will be covered by the cookie policy of the Commission, which is available here: https://ec.europa.eu/info/cookies_en.

When you visit the website(s) of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** and when you register, we will indicate in the specific privacy statement how long we will keep the browser history of your visit. This information will then be deleted. The collection, aggregation and anonymising operations are performed in the data centre of the European Commission under adequate security measures.

Cookies are stored by Europa Analytics, the corporate service which measures the effectiveness and efficiency of the European Commission’s websites on EUROPA. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00685 (Europa Analytics).

Enabling these cookies is not strictly necessary for the website to work but it will provide you with a better browsing experience. You can delete or block these cookies, but if you do that, some features of the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** website may not work as intended.

The cookie-related information is not used to identify data subjects personally and the pattern data is fully under the Commission’s control. These cookies are not used for any purpose other than those described here.

Should you wish to opt your personal data out of our anonymised, aggregated statistics, you can do so on our cookies page. In particular, you can control and/or delete those cookies as you wish.

Third party IT tools, including Social Media

We may use third party IT tools to inform about and promote the International Urban and Regional Cooperation – **IURC Annual Event 2021** through widely used communication channels, including the social media. You may be able to watch our videos, which may be also uploaded to one of our social media pages and follow links from our website to other relevant social media.

In order to protect your privacy, our use of third party IT tools to connect to those services does not set cookies when our website pages are loaded on your computer (or other devices), nor are you immediately redirected to those social media or other websites. Only in the event that you click on a button or “play” on a video to watch it, a cookie of the social media company concerned

will be installed on your device. If you do not click on any social media buttons or videos, no cookies will be installed on your device by third parties.

In order to view such third-party content on our websites, a message will alert you that you need to accept those third parties' specific Terms and Conditions, including their cookie policies, over which the Commission has no control.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

You have consented to provide your personal data to the data controller for the present processing operation. You can withdraw your consent at any time by notifying the data controller via email to coordination-unit@iurc.eu. The withdrawal of your consent will not affect the lawfulness of the processing carried out before you have withdrawn the consent.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the data controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.
