Seberang Perai have successfully replicated two circular economy waste management models post-study visits to Vila Nova de Famalicão & Maia: (1) Bagan Ajam Market and (2) eco-school vocational training (citizen centric community programmes)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Circular Economy Waste Management, Urban Agenda/Planning, Education, Jobs & Skills The relationship between Portuguese-Penang cities is very much focused on playing a very active role in the dynamism of their cities, defining, promoting and implementing actions in different key areas where sustainable development is one of the top priorities addressing economy, waste management, energy consumption, climate change, citizen awareness and social engagement. In relation to the transition to a circular economy model, it is of paramount relevance to promote cooperation by exchanging best practices with a view to improve the established system of circular economy waste management in all cities. The cluster approach is meant to facilitate all cities, to exchange methodologies, systems thinking created by the network, and also share and exchange knowledge and expertise. The completed operation design of two pilot projects is below:





MAIN CHALLENGE AND SOLUTION

Seberang Perai's Urban challenges/priorities: food waste and food security, single-use plastics, water security, construction & demolition waste, e-waste and hazardous waste. The Seberang Perai Action Plan 2023 – 2030 was launched in January 2023 and the collaboration with Maia and Vila Nova de Famalicão (VNF) will contribute towards the targets of the Seberang Perai Circular Economy Action Plan 2020 - 2030 focusing on (a) exploring the private sector CSR funding for the eco-schools' vocational programmes where Monster Hospital model in VNF was localized to fit the local community needs, (b) operational design of the pilot projects related to zero waste markets (c) activate the Local Action Groups (bottom-up approach) in the engagement process and citizen centric campaigns and approaches on activating a circular economy and sustainable lifestyle and (d) create win-win opportunities for capacity building, knowledge exchange and to showcase the pilot actions as a best practice cooperation between all cities.

- The activities during the study visits in collaboration with private sector and community gardens have been incorporated within the joint pilot actions involving the wet markets in Penang cities in tackling food waste and establishing the eco-schools vocational training programme to reduce the volume of e-waste.
- The joint pilot actions for 2023 have incorporated elements of quadruple helix cooperation with key actors along the value chain.
- The joint pilot actions were all self-funded by the city council and contributed towards lessons learned, translating the knowledge exchange sessions and on-site visits in Portugal to actions on the ground.
- The formulated capacity building programmes related to closing the loop on food waste & e-waste coupled with citizen-centric campaigns in the Penang cities enhanced the EU visibility at community levels and promoted a circular lifestyle amongst Penangites.









LESSONS LEARNED

Empowering the community groups using a quadruple helix model (public-private sectors, academia & civil society) accelerates the adoption of circular economy lifestyles


